H.O. GOWLLAND DEAD IN HIS 64TH YEAR

Well-known Optician Was
Author of Several
Scientific Books

Henry Orford Gowlland, well-known optician in Montreal, and author of several scientific books, died at the Homoeopathic Hospital early last night in his 64th year. While Mr. Gowlland, who lived at 10 Burton avenue, Westmount, had not been actively engaged in business for himself for the past three years, he had retained his connection with McGill University, where he worked in the laboratories supervising the care of instruments.

Mr. Gowlland, whose family has for generations been connected with the optical business in England, came from the Old Country, about 1900 and settled in Philadelphia. He was at this time employed by the optical firm of Queen and Company. While thus engaged he wrote several books on science.

In 1910 he came to Montreal and entered business on his own account. Three years ago he retired from this occupation.

He is survived by his wife, formerly Miss Mary Ann Holder; one son, George Orford Gowlland; and one daughter, Miss Gladys Mary Gowlland, all of Montreal. He also leaves three brothers, Egbert, of London; William, of Bournemouth; and Charles, of Eastbourne, England.
